PASTOR'S CORNER

What captures the imagination of many these days? It goes without saying that this must be a very short but powerful word: fear. This emotion is a fundamental feature of our life, and it cannot be eradicated. Basically, fear anticipates something and is not experienced directly; in other words, it is an anxiety about what might happen. This is why fear often leads to failure. Someone once said that fear is Satan's press secretary. It is a very interesting remark, because it reminds us that fear will try to convince us of all kinds of lies about God, others, and ourselves. But this is spiritually toxic news, for wherever we go, we will find that what we are running from is there ahead of us.

Certainly, this uncontrollable dread of the future is sometimes justified, but be wary: it wants to kidnap your present moment with God and yourself. So sit with your fear and listen to the whisper of Jesus in your restless heart: "Satan's promises are the best at first, but their true fulfilment is always the worst. He promises pleasure that always ends with pain. He promises profit that usually ends with loss. He promises life and pays with death." With Jesus on your side, you are not captive to your fear. You are simply free to carry it like a costly treasure to the empty tomb to be among those who marvel with a contemplative gaze of amazement on Easter Sunday. Basically, this is what Lent is really all about if you are truly serious about your own gift of faith, hope and trust, for as someone metaphorically said, "In order to rise from its own ashes, a phoenix first must be burned." So when we do find the courage to overcome our fears, is it not true that we often look back and say to ourselves, "Why was I so worried about this or that?"

P.S. "Be not afraid." Do you know how many times this phrase appears in the Bible? 365 times. So what is God trying to tell us? Perhaps this: "You are too blessed to be stressed."
