PASTOR'S CORNER

Over 60 years ago Pope John XXIII spoke of opening the windows to let some fresh air into the church. They were opened by Vatican Council II, but someone must have felt a draft. For Pope Francis seems interested not only in opening the windows but the doors also. He said, "The word 'Catholic' after all, means universal, all-embracing. This is why the church is the home of all, not a small chapel that can hold only a small group of selected people."

In light of this statement, we need to "read the signs of the times." By this I mean we are meant to look at the world with clear eyes, to see what is happening, to be attentive. But this attention is of a particular type. It is not the attention of the scientist or the philosopher or the politician, though it can include those. It is an attention to the things of God. It is quite important, because there are many who are still enthralled to a deist view of God, whereby God is a distant and aloof "first cause" of the universe, uninvolved with the world he has made. But St. Thomas Aquinas taught that God is in all things "by essence, presence, and power", and that God providentially cares for every aspect of his creation. Therefore, we should expect to see signs of his presence and activity in nature, in history, and in human affairs. And once we see, we are meant to speak!

In a way, followers of lesus are not looking at the signs of the times for their own benefit, but rather that they might share their prophetic perspective with everyone else. So look around, look with attention, look with the eyes of faith! Otherwise we risk "losing the freshness and fragrance of the Gospel" as people may perceive the church only as a human institution which has locked itself up in small-minded rules. This is why the Holy Father recommends neither promotion nor aggression but dialogue. The truth can speak for itself; it has its own appeal, and it will find its own way to penetrate between bone and marrow in each person's heart, without any persuasion from either party. In the process of getting to know each other, listening to each other and improving our knowledge of the world around us, God's mysterious healing, and reconciling grace seeps into our hearts. All we need to do is love God and do unto others as we would have them do unto us.
