### THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT





When is love real? To find the right answer, we need to ask more questions: How do you know that someone loves you? Is it when they tell you they do? Anyone can say that. Is it when they buy you gifts? Not every gift comes from the heart. Is it when they want to be around you to the exclusion of others? Maybe they are gaining something for themselves from that closeness. On the other hand, how do you know that you love God? Is it by your faith tradition, like being a Christian? Identifying with a religion does not mean love for God. Is it by going to Church and praying all the time? No, even Jesus said, "This people honor me with their lips, but their heart is far from me" (Matt 15:8), because a disguise for love is easy on the lips. Sometimes, we mistake our liking or feelings towards people for love. Sometimes, we confuse religious activities with love for God. Love is beyond seasonal excitement and activities. When love is genuine, there are no conditions; it comes from a heart of sacrifice, which is the true measure of love. In other words, love, where it is real, is always active and sacrificial, not beneficial. But not everybody has the same point of view, for everyone thinks he knows everything about love, but not everyone agrees on what love really is. Perhaps this is why writing about romantic love in his famous novel, Captain Corelli's Mandolin, the English novelist, Louis de Bernières, states: "Love is not breathlessness. It is not excitement. It is not the promulgation of eternal passion. That is just being-in-love, which any fool can do. Love itself is what is left over when being-in-love has burned away." And Advent has something to tell us about this fact. So open your eyes to see what this secular world fails to perceive these days, and then your Advent preparation for Christmas will take on a deeper spiritual meaning. And next week, just before Christmas, I will look at this short and sweet word strictly from our Christian perspective.
