PASTOR'S CORNER

Here are my 10 basic rules for a fulfilling and meaningful life:

1. **Micro-attention:** Stare at the world with intention, because nothing is too small or too mundane to deserve careful observation.
2. **See life as revelation:** The way God reveals things to you matters. So do not ignore the particular, personal insights that arrive in your daily life.
3. **Attend to the Divine in the ordinary:** God often shows up in dusty roads, hot afternoons, unremarkable people, and unexpected places, so look for Him there.
4. **Routines must be alive to bear fruit:** If you let it, your daily routines can become a living sap that enriches your soul by engaging with it in a meaningful way of reflection.
5. **Read deeply and eclectically:** Books are meant to expand your inner life, not just as a mere diversion, but as a vital nourishment for the imagination. So we are to learn much but maintain humility, for as John the Baptist famously proclaimed, "*He must increase and I must decrease*" (*Jn 3:30*).
6. **Embrace distractions:** Life will often interrupt you, so do not flinch. Stay attentive even when it is inconvenient, because God may want to say something to you.
7. **Don't worry about not being safe:** God also meets you in uncertainty more than anywhere else.
8. **Resist cynicism:** It is easy to get jaded. Instead, try to dare to look again and notice beauty, goodness and hope, even when life or others feel dull.
9. **Let curiosity be generous:** Learn from others' insights too, because wisdom grows in conversation, not monologue. Only in this way we can truly enjoy life and understand its purpose.
10. **Live as though the world is sacred:** Whether it is a busy morning, a quiet afternoon, or a peaceful evening in ordinary time, look at reality as an invitation to wonder, not as a backdrop for boredom, for as a poet wrote:

*"Life molds us like clay,
Alchemy of joy and sorrow,
Each tear a drop of cosmic ink,
Writing stories on our souls
in this grace-filled experience of God."*


