## SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME



**PASTOR'S CORNER** 

How do you make the most of your New Year? Let me help you with four keys. I will label them A, B, C and D:

A - <u>Accept responsibility for your life.</u> This is something that is hard for many people to do. Some people would rather blame someone else for the problems and difficulties in their lives. These are people that go around looking for someone who will accept responsibility for them - someone who will accept responsibility for the way they live their lives and the choices they make. When things do not turn out the way they hope, they have someone they can blame. Accepting responsibility for our lives is not a popular concept in our society, because we live in a culture that embraces a concept called "political correctness". This basically says, "None of your problems are your fault. Everything bad in your life is somebody else's fault. Blame the environment. Blame the educator. Blame your parents. Blame anybody else, but it is not your fault." It is always somebody else's fault. You will never be a success in life, and you will never make your life count, if you have the attitude that it is someone else's fault. St. Paul tells us in his letter to the Galatians, *"Each person must be responsible for himself"* (6:5).

**B** - <u>Believe that you can change</u>. Stop saying, "I can't" and start saying, "I can". The person that believes that they can change with the help of God *will change*. Many people never succeed in life because they believe they cannot change. They never enjoy life because life to them is just one big failure after another. They face a new year with regret rather than the joy of knowing that God has given them the opportunity to make a difference in their own lives. St. Paul in his letter to the Philippians tells us, "There is nothing I cannot master with the help of Christ who gives me strength" (4:13).

C - <u>Clarify what you really want in life</u>. You must decide what is important and what is not important. God has given each of us an incredible gift called the freedom of choice. That is one of the things that makes us like God. In other words, you need to make up your mind what you want out of life, because if you aim at nothing, you are going to hit it. Jesus tells us, "Let your word 'Yes' be 'Yes' and 'No' be 'No.' Any-thing more than this comes from the evil one" (Matt 5:37).

**D** - <u>Don't wait to begin</u>. Do it now! These three words can change your life. If you wait for the right situation or the right kind of circumstances, you will miss out on life all together. There will never be an ideal set of circumstances to start out on. To make the most of 2025 and to accomplish the things you want to accomplish, start now, because things may not settle down or get better until you are in the coffin. The Book of Ecclesiastes tells us, "If you wait for perfect conditions, you will never get anything done" (11:4).

**P.S.** Someone wrote, "I was a revolutionary when I was young and all my prayer to God was this: 'Lord, give me the energy to change the world.' As I approached middle age and realized that my life was half gone without my changing a single soul, I changed my prayer to, 'Lord, give me the grace to change all those who come into contact with me, just my family and friends, and I shall be satisfied.' Now that I am an old man and my days are numbered, I have begun to see how foolish I have been. My one prayer now is this: 'Lord, give me the grace to change myself.' If I had prayed for this right from the start, I would not have wasted my life."
