#### **PASTOR'S CORNER**

Why are you envious? Did I open your "Pandora's box," so to speak? I ask these questions because Lent is a good time to try, at least, to eradicate this ugly vice from your heart and mind. Of course, it is your choice whether to do so or not. I like this inspiring quote from Man's Search for Meaning by Viktor Frankl: "Everything can be taken from a man but one thing: the last of the human freedoms to choose one's attitude in any given set of circumstances, to choose one's own way." Even more profound is the context, because he drew this conclusion from his experience in a concentration camp. But to undertake this difficult task of becoming envy-free in a meaningful way, you will need to keep in mind this perennial truth: Never treat another human being as a means to an end, but rather as an end unto himself.

Envy is usually defined as "sorrow over another's good fortune." Since it lacks charity, it is a sin. And not just any sin, but a capital sin, because it readily gives rise to other sins that may be graver than envy itself. Unfortunately, no one is immune to it because of Original Sin in the Garden of Eden. This is why people often resent the fact that others score better on a test, or that they make more money for less work, for instance. But jealousy can be contravened by our effort to be content with what we have and who we are. Jesus often tells us not to worry about what we lack, but to ask our Father in heaven for what we need, for as someone once said, "We need to learn how to want what we have, and not to have what we want in order to get steady and stable in our life." I think that this phrase is worth remembering. So put it on the refrigerator or on your screensaver. There is no better one-line guide to the good life that is free of any tinge of jealousy during this Lenten journey and beyond.

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P.S. Just one more quote to give you food for thought: "If you suddenly find yourselves dealing with episodes of jealousy and you are not sure what is causing them, look at your level of gratitude. How grateful are you for the gifts which you possess? Jealousy is seldom eliminated by will power; it is rather eradicated by our daily thankfulness for many talents we possess."
