EXALTATION OF THE HOLY CROSS



PASTOR'S CORNER

By virtue of our baptism, we are all called to be holy, and we need to take this responsibility seriously. The Catechism of the Catholic Church says this of holiness: "All Christians in any state or walk of life are called to the fullness of Christian life and to the perfection of charity. In other words, we are all called to holiness. In order to reach this perfection, the faithful should use the strength dealt out to them by Christ's gift, so that doing the will of the Father in everything, they may wholeheartedly devote themselves to the glory of God and to the service of their neighbor. Thus, the holiness of the People of God will grow in fruitful abundance, as is clearly shown in the history of the Church through the lives of so many saints." (2013) So to achieve holiness, we need to go back to basics. Here are six steps you can take to achieve this goal:

- 1. You must desire holiness. If you do not have your heart set on this burning desire, your plans will fall through. In general, this long process of spiritual growth is mysterious. But when you see God at work, whether in big or small ways, your love will grow, and so will your faith and hope.
- **2. You must surrender your life to Jesus**. When you seek God with all your heart, hunger and thirst for Him, you will receive the grace for holiness.
- 3. You must repent of your weakness and sins on an ongoing basis. You need to get into the habit of examining your conscience at the end of each day and go to confession on a regular basis in order to "avoid the near occasion of sin."
- **4. You must learn how to pray fervently**. It is critical you learn how to pray from your heart in order to praise God for who He is. With daily practice, you will become better at noticing the ways the Spirit is moving in your life.
- **5.** You must love fervently. It is the most important act you will perform if you can love unconditionally. Moreover, the Holy Spirit will give you the grace to say a deeper "yes" to the Lord, because the third Person of the Blessed Trinity has the power to get inside your life and stir things up.
- **6.** You must live a sacramental life. This requires leading a life in which you hunger and thirst, first and foremost, for the Eucharist so that you have the grace and courage not to compromise your desire for holiness.
- **P.S.** If you still have second thoughts about whether to be or not to be holy, remember this: The warning is clear. The urgency is obvious. The time is short, for as someone rightly noted, "Our popular culture is a place where flattery is called love, propaganda is called knowledge, tension is called peace, gossip is called news and auto-tune is called singing." So, if you want to be healthy, then you must live a healthy lifestyle. And this thought is well worth pondering while you are still a work in progress.
